Dear Members, here is our latest update on progress at Relative Towers. Firstly, a bit of admin.

Standing Orders and Direct Debits

We have now opened the new RHSoc Bank Account and Alan Holmes has transferred the old RHSoc account monies to us. We note that a few Subscription payments have still been trickling in. Could we ask you once again that you please cancel all Standing Orders and Direct Debits to the old RHSoc account. This will shortly be closed completely and any monies paid into it could disappear.

Mountaineering Scotland (MS) Affiliation

There appears to be some confusion about the affiliation process. If you are not already a member of MS or BMC or MI, you do not need to take any steps to join MS at present. We will advise you in December what the combined cost of RHSoc and MS Membership is going to be, and we will collect that sum from you. We will do the affiliation process and you will receive your MS number from them by email. It currently looks as though there will be a slight increase from £16.25 to £17.50 in the MS Club Subscription.

The gloomy summit of Boreray (A Litterick)


For the first time, everybody on this RHSoc organised trip was in both RHSoc and either MS or BMC. This will be standard practice in future years.

A total of 24 have been certified to travel to the Stacs should a fair-weather window arrive in the next few weeks. First 12 to Leverburgh get on the boat!


Annual Dinner and AGM, Banavie, Nr Fort William. 6th June, 2020
